This years Group 7 1st Grade competition is the most evenly balanced competition in years, with the competition Leaders sitting on 8 points and last place only 4 points, making today's fixtures vitally important to each Clubs chances in securing Semi Finals spots later in the year.

## Group Seven launches its own Magic Round, which comes with beer and food

It was raining and gloomy during the launch, but the spirits were high heading into Group Seven rugby league's inaugural Magic Round.

The showpiece at Artie Smith Oval in Bomaderry on Saturday, May 31, is similar to the NRL's highly successful Magic Round, which happens once a year, when the NRL relocates to Brisbane for one weekend to play every match of the round.

The initiative began in 2019 and was a success, with 134,677 attending Lang Park across the four-day event.

The main difference with Magic Round in Bomaderry is that all Group Seven round games will be played over one day at the same venue.

Group Seven Rugby League football operations manager Ashton Sims has also ensured the Magic Round runs in conjunction with the Beer Footy Food Festival presented by the Good Time Beer Co.

"This concept has probably been about 18 months in the making. It was something that we've seen other competitions do and deliver really well," Sims said.

"That's why we've teamed up with the Beer Footy Food Festival guys, as we want to make sure we deliver a Magic Round that's done right from the start and to the highest of expectations.

"It's really pleasing to see the good progress we've made to this point, but obviously the hard work is certainly ahead, and we're looking forward to getting into that."

Sims said Group Seven was also looking forward to finally playing rugby league games at the recently renovated Artie Smith Oval.

"It's been an AFL and cricket ground here, and it's something that we've looked at from afar.

"Teams come and play at Bomaderry Sporting Complex across the road. You come past, look at the big lights and the new facilities and wish you could play there.

"They've played big games at the Sydney Cricket Ground for over 100 years, so we thought, let's try to use this brilliant facility we've got right here.

"I'd like to give a big shout-out to the Shoalhaven City Council, who have worked tirelessly with us to deliver four first-grade matches, all of the highest quality, here next Saturday."

The action kicks off at noon when the Berry Shoalhaven Heads Magpies play the Milton Ulladulla Bulldogs. The Jamberoo Superoos will then battle Albion Park Oak Flats Eagles at 1.45pm before the Nowra Bomaderry Jets take on the Shellharbour Sharks at 3.30pm.

The day's final contest is the mouth-watering clash between the Stingrays and Gerringong Lions to be played under lights from 5.15pm.

"The plan is to make this an annual event and grow it yearly," Sims said.

"We're going two feet in from the very start here, but we're going to review how it all went, the viewers' experience, the fans' spectacle and how the key stakeholders and our teams enjoyed the overall experience.

"We're expecting a big crowd next Saturday. It looks like the weather will be kind to us, maybe not this week, but the weather will be a bit kinder to us next week.

"At the end of the day, we just want to deliver events that haven't been done here before in Group 7. We want to go outside our comfort zone. Just because we've done it one way for so long doesn't mean we must continue doing it.

"We need to implement these programs, these events, these strategies, these actions to ensure that rugby league continues to be the stronghold here on the south coast, and also our wider regions."

Representatives from the nine Group Seven clubs were unanimous in their support for the inaugural Magic Round.






