

Atistorians Report 2025 Grand Final

Six New Premiers. Regardless of todays results there will be six new premiers for the 2025 season with only Milton Ulladulla in the Ladies Tag Division 1 repeating their premiership of 2024. One has to go back to 1963 and 64 when there were three competitions First, Reserve and 18's won in successive years by Albion Park first grade and Shellharbour reserve and 18's and it has never happened since. New Premiers are not unusual in Group Seven where premierships are shared around more than in many other areas and it will be the fourth time in the past ten years (2022,19 and 17) that the three grades have all changed. St Georges Basin won their first ever Regan Cup Premiership last Sunday and other new premiers were Milton Ulladulla League Tag 2 and Crookhaven Regan Cup League Tag.

First Grade. Kiama and Shellharbour have only opposed each other in two grand finals 1983 when Kiama won 38-6 and 2018 where Shellharbour won 32-12 and that was their latest premiership after winning six between 1939 and 2001. Kiama last won the premiership in 2019 defeating Jamberoo 28-14 after being runners up in the previous two seasons and breaking a drought of 34 years and that was the club's 12th top grade premiership 1925-1985. Six of the 2019 team are playing today including Cameron Vazzoler, Tom Atkins, Callum Thistlewaite, David Martin, Tom Angel and Keiran Poole, Coach was Matt Clarke. Shellharbour will have three from the 2018 team Wade Aitken, Kade Sampson and Jye Brooker and Abed Atallah is again the coach. Shellharbour are playing their third consecutive grand final.

In Reserve Grade it will be the first ever meeting of Kiama and Stingrays in a grand final and the Stingrays will be playing for their initial premiership. Kiama have won eleven premierships 1920-2022.

Again, in the Under 18's Gerringong and Berry Shoalhaven Heads will meet in their first ever grand final. Gerringong won the first ever competition in 1938 and then won four 1994-2022. Berry last won this grade in 1983 and have qualified for the grand final from the elimination semi final and looking to break a 42-year premiership drought.

Congratulations to Stingrays of Shellharbour on winning their second Club Championship with Shellharbour Sharks second. The Leo O'Dwyer Cup for most competition points in the second half of the season was a three-way tie with Albion Park Oak Flats, Gerringong and Kiama all on 14 points one point ahead of Stingrays and Shellharbour. The Park will win the Trophy on differential. They last won in 2011. The Ladies teams continue to grow and congratulations to all involved in what is now a big part of rugby league.

The 2025 season was interrupted by wet weather creating a headache for officials and clubs in re scheduling games and some clubs missing out on home games. The First Ever Magic Round played at the Artie Smith Oval Bomaderry created great interest and a big amount of publicity for the league. To all the referees and touch judges appointed for grand final day congratulations and the Group is lucky to have such an active referee's association. To Brad Moulds many thanks for compiling all the scores throughout the season keeping everyone informed of results. And to all club and group officials and volunteers who back up every season as part of teams, ground duties, canteens etc and not forgetting the great Sponsors of the Group and Clubs who play such a vital part in the game. Also to the Service Clubs who help on the gates and a word of praise to the Bar TV camera people who are out in all-weather filming the games.

Vale Angus (Gus) Miller 1925-2025). One of the South Coast greatest players Gus Miller of Berry passed away on August 4th, 2025, and hundreds of people attended his Funeral in Berry on September 2nd his 100th Birthday. A Second Row Forward Gus represented New South Wales v Queensland in 1946, 48 and 49, Country v City for seven years and played for Southern Division and or Country against all the International Touring teams (many of the games played at Wollongong Showground) Great Britain (with two wins), France, New Zealand, The Marois and the American All Stars captaining several of the teams. He won four first grade premierships with Berry the first in 1941 as a 15 year old then 1951,52 and 53. He was unlucky to miss selection in the 1948 Kangaroo Tour of England. He retired in 1957 after breaking his leg in a game at Kangaroo Valley. Gus was a Group 7 Life Member for a remarkable 65 years honoured in 1960 for his contribution as a player having never held any position in the Group. A Dairy Farmer Gus lived his 100 years in the same house and was part of the Berry Town Band for over eighty years and many other organisations in the town. Gus was a remarkable man with a great memory and wonderful sense of humour. Rest In Peace Gus.

2025 React Facility Solutions Group 7 First Grade Grand Final!!

We have now reached the pinnacle of the First Grade Season, the 2025 React Facility Solutions Group 7 Grand Final, which will feature the mighty Kiama Knights squaring off against the determined Shellharbour Sharks in a showdown that promises passion, skill, desire & Finals footy at it's absolute best!

The last time these 2 Teams met was only 2 weeks ago in the Grand Final Qualifier, in which the Knights grinded out a 22-16 victory at Ron Costello Oval. The Knights, lead by Captain Tom Angel, influential Prop Matt Nicholson and key half Sam Hooper, exploded out to a 20-0 lead after 30 mins, with the Sharks scoring an important try on the stroke of halftime, by man mountain Palu Tausala. Two Early 2nd half tries to McElhone (48th Min) and Aitken (55th Min) got the game back to 22-16 with 20 minutes to play, but the Knights' trademark grit and defensive steel held firm to keep the Sharks at bay.

The Knights have enjoyed a vital week's rest to refocus on the mission ahead, & will be buoyed by their incredible attacking display in the opening 30 mins the last time they played Shellharbour. The Knights have 6 Players in their lineup who tasted 1st Grade Premiership glory the last time Kiama hoisted the Artie Smith Trophy in 2019 (Thistlewaite, Atkins, Vazzoler, Martin, Poole & Angel) and all their experience will be called upon in the games toughest moments if the Knights are to be triumphant on Sunday.

Standing in their way and coming off a resounding 34-8 victory over the Albion Park Oak Flats Eagles in last weekend's Preliminary Final at Michael Cronin Oval, are the dangerous & relentless Shellharbour Sharks. The Sharks are making their 3rd successive Grand Final appearance in 2025, and will hungrier than ever to lift this coveted piece of silverware. The Sharks will be looking to build on last week's impressive performance in which Props Bryce Magnone and Jayden Morgan were powerful, with their NSW Country Representative - Braxton Wallace showing his class with a brilliant all-round performance and five goals from the boot.

In the 2nd fixture of the day, pits 2 of the Heavyweights of the Reserve Grade competition, the Kiama Knights and the Stingrays of Shellharbour in what will certainly be an enthralling encounter.

The Kiama Knights have been the benchmark all year, finishing the regular season as Minor Premiers with an outstanding record of 14 wins, 1 draw and just 2 losses. Just as impressive has been their defensive resilience, conceding only 160 points across the campaign, easily the best in the Reserve Grade competition.

Lead by inspirational Captain and Kiama Stalwart Matt Gladman, the Knights will be looking to emulate their 2018 heroics and come away with the Walter Elliot Premiership Cup on what will be a warm afternoon at Centenary Field. Reputation will mean nothing to the Stingrays of Shellharbour after their gritty 15-14 Extra Time win in last weekend's Grand Final Qualifier at Michael Cronin Oval over cross town rivals, Shellharbour Sharks. This game was tight from start to finish, with the scores locked at 6-6 at halftime, then 14-14 at fulltime, Daniel Brady took the game by the scruff of the neck and slotted the game winning field goal, 5 mins into extra time.

The Stingrays bring strong form into the Grand Final, riding a three-game winning streak through the 2025 Finals Series. Their biggest threat is undoubtedly Jayden Harris, who has been electric all season with 24 tries and 170 points, the leading try and point scorer in Reserve Grade this year.


