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RESILIENT STINGRAYS PREPARING FOR PRELIMINARY FINAL BATTLE AFTER ENDING GERRINGONG HOODOO

The Shellharbour Stingrays will look to seal a place in the club's first top grade grand final when they take on Albion Park-Oak Flats in the Group 7 preliminary final on Saturday.

The 'Rays reached the second grand final qualifier after twice coming from behind to defeat Gerringong 19-18 in a classic minor semi final at Ron Costello Oval on Sunday, only claiming the lead for the first time with 20 seconds remaining courtesy of a clutch Isaac Morris field goal.

Now preparing for a clash with the Eagles, who suffered their biggest loss of the campaign so far in a second successive loss to Kiama 28-8 in the major semi, Stingrays coach Mathew Burke said his side cannot afford to take the minor premiers lightly.

"[We] definitely can't write them off, they've been the form team all year, they're minor premiers, they've deserved it," he said.

"We haven't beaten them yet, we had a close one down at Flinders when they beat us on the bell, and they probably pulled our pants down a little bit at their home ground, so it's definitely going to be a challenge."

Despite the challenge that awaits them, the Stingrays enter the match knowing they can outlast even the best sides in sudden-death finals football.

After Gerringong centre James Kunkler crossed for a double inside the opening 26 minutes on the way to a hat-trick for the match, Stingrays set about clawing their way back into the match, with Liam Henry and Trey Barlow crossing either side of half time to level the scores at 12-all.

However, the Lions again took the lead 18-12 when Kunkler charged onto a Wes Pring short ball to complete his hat-trick at the 56 minute mark.

Again, the Stingrays found a way to climb off the canvas, with Jake Stig sweeping around on a right side shift inside the Gerringong 20 metre zone to break the line and score under the posts.

That left the scores level again at 18-all, and after Lions five-eighth Jarrod Tiyce's first shot sailed wide, Morris finally got his opportunity to have a shot under heavy pressure, which he nailed to lift his side into the third week of the postseason.

Although he admitted the match was not a comfortable watch from the dugout, Burke said the most pleasing thing was the resilience his side showed against a team that had beaten them in three of the past four finals series, including in last year's elimination final.

"It's probably something we haven't shown against them and Albion Park over the years, is a bit of resilience," he said.

"Just to hang in there, we've tended to switch off for 10 to 20-minute periods and they put a couple of tries on us, but this weekend I feel even though at the start they went ahead, we were still in it and we were still probably the better side there.

"Just to grind it out and get a win like that, it was just amazing.

"They've knocked us out in the previous years I think three times, and just to finally get the wood over them once was good."

As for Morris' match-winning field goal, Burke said he wanted his halfback to take the shot earlier than the 80th minute, but Gerringong's relentless pressure prevented him from being able to get a kick away.

"I wanted to go at about five minutes to go, I wanted to just get it over and try to hold the lead, but they were good at rushing, knew when we were going to take it," he said.

"Even that last one there when he knocked it over, it was very rushed, it wobbled over, but I couldn't be happier for him."

In the major semi final, defending premier Kiama booked its place in the grand final with a 20-point victory over the Albion Park-Oak Flats Eagles at Centenary Field.

The Knights ran in five tries to three, with fullback Brad Killmore crossing for a double as his side defeated the minor premiers for the second time in three weeks.

Saturday's preliminary final between the Eagles and Stingrays kicks off at 3pm at the Kiama Showground.
